WORLD HEALTH DAY





EAS COLLEGE COUNSELLING LAB

Vision: "Don't just choose University- choose a future"

Mission: "Building an entrance for students to make their way from core to crest"



We are thrilled to share the incredible journey of our students' placements at prestigious universities. Since 2018, when part-time College counsellors who regularly visited EAS and offered advices to our students, we launched our College Counselling Lab in 2019 occasionally. Wegradually began offering regular counselling sessions to our students, and now we have our own college counselling lab based on L2 Concept (Lab and Library) at Excelsior in 2021.

It gives us enormous joy to share with you Excelsior's phenomenal achievements over the last four years.

The College Board provided us with a CEEB (College Entrance Examination Board) code in 2019. With CEEB code we can ensure materials like scores and transcripts are sent to right place. In2019, our proposal to become a UCAS centre was approved and our school now has a BUZZWORD for UK applications. During the application process, EAS has full access to the application. We are able to use our UCAS advisor portal to manage send and track the progress of our students' applications. EAS is viewed as trusted source of application by universities and colleges. We achieved authorization from the College Board to operate as an SAT test centre in 2023. We have successfully been conducting digital SAT examinations since March,2023, at our school campus. The SAT offers students the unique opportunity to apply to a variety of programs in India and abroad with just one test. Students have the exciting opportunity to become College BoardIndia Scholars and earn a full-tuition scholarship to participating universities through their SAT scores. There are many Indian universities that has a requirement of SAT Scores.

From Grade 8 onwards, we begin counselling students for their profile building. Every year, during the third quarter of session, the school hosts a subject choice fair to assist students of grades 8 and 10 to select academic subject and curriculum choices. The school organizes university tour for all students from grades 9 to 12 and provides a vast exposure to get to know the university's facilities and faculty throughout the visit. During the summer and winter breaks, we also make a concerted effort to assist students in improving their profiles and informing them about numerous internship opportunities. Every year, we host a university fair where representatives from significant institutionsgather to enlighten parents and students about the admissions process. We have tools to empower students – 1) Three-way meeting between the parent, student and counsellor/Two-way meeting between student and counsellor 2) Robust communication 3) Student-led initiatives in school.
